

Key Accomplishments: QEP Implementation Year 1 (2024-25 AY)

Curriculum Development: Led and supported expansion of curricular opportunities for students to learn about climate change and climate solutions.

- Established the <u>Climate Studies (CLI) Course Attribute</u>, which supports the forthcoming interdisciplinary Climate Studies minor
- 53 <u>courses approved for the CLI attribute</u> with 20 different academic departments (26 prefixes) represented
- > 50 courses approved for the new Sustainability & Climate Literacy curricular component in Gen Ed

Faculty/Staff Development: Led and supported programming for faculty/staff across campus who want to help students grow their climate literacy and response-ability.

- 12 faculty/staff development programs led or co-led by QEP
- >2500 person-hours of climate literacy focused faculty/staff development led or supported by QEP
- 92 faculty from 27 academic departments participated in <u>course (re)design</u> <u>trainings</u> that support faculty to teach about climate change and climate solutions from their own disciplinary perspectives

Co-Curricular/Engagement: Led and supported programming to engage students in beyond-the-classroom learning about climate change and climate solutions.

- 42 climate focused/related events led by QEP and/or partners across campus
- >3000 participants in QEP co-curricular engagement programs
- >\$20,000 in <u>QEP Engagement Grants</u> awarded to 9 faculty members
